
Doghouses

Garages



Imagine groups of three black keys are a garage where you can park two cars. The first two letters of garage are GA; these are the names of the two white keys in the middle of the group of three black keys. Use the music alphabet to

determine the names of the white keys on either side of the garage.

- 2. Label all the GA piano keys
- 3. Label all the F and B piano keys
- 4. Play all FGAB piano keys on your piano
