




Song Sundae

8		Mystery Prize	
7		And a cherry on top (if you don't like cherries, maybe you can get double sprinkles.)	
6		Sprinkles!!	
5		Whipped cream?	
4		How about some chocolate syrup or hot fudge?	
3		Finally, ice cream!	
2		Now you have an empty spoon to go in your empty bowl.	
1		You are the proud owner of an empty bowl!	

Suggestions for using the Song Sundae:

Aim to memorize 1-2 pieces per month. (My students use the Song Sundae chart from September through April. We make our ice cream sundaes at a piano party/rehearsal two weeks before the spring recital in May.)

Log pieces in pencil so they can be replaced when better pieces are memorized.

Once the chart is completed, **choose a day to enjoy an ice cream sundae together.** You might consider playing all your memorized pieces for a family concert! (The question mark at the top is a "Mystery Prize" that can be as grand or as simple as you choose; maybe a trip to the park or extra time for electronics.)

These pieces become your **AAA** list: Pieces you can play **Anytime, Anywhere, for Anyone.**
